

Rights of Way Pesticide Training

This class will provide information for people doing Rights of Way pest control. It is appropriate for anyone with a commercial pesticide applicator's license (QAL or QAC) in Rights of Way Pest Control (Category C) that needs continuing education (CE) units. It is also appropriate for anyone who would like to be licensed in Rights of Way Pest Control. The course will cover: Integrated Pest Management (IPM); how to implement IPM in Rights of Way; vegetation management; the use of herbicides and non-herbicidal techniques for reducing unwanted vegetation; how weeds develop resistance to herbicides, and what land managers and pesticide applicators can do to identify and manage herbicide resistance.
