We will begin at 5:00 pm and dinner will be provided. **We are going to need judges and more judges.** Check with your Community Club Leader to find out when the record books are due to your club!

Please remember that ANY Record Book which will be put into the competition must have the REQUIRED check sheet filled out CORRECTLY with all SIGNATURES. Leader Certification Meetings for the 2017-2018 4-H Year

The 4-H Youth Development Program of the University of California is committed to providing a safe environment for young people in all Cooperative Extension activities. **New 4-H Leaders and all potential volunteers** are required to submit an application, be fingerprinted for a background check, complete online trainings mandated by California 4-H, **and** attend a leader certification meeting. *Only after completing all of the above requirements satisfactorily, can a volunteer hold project meetings.*

The **second** Leader Certification Meeting for the 2017-2018 year is on **TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2017**, at the Durham Library on Durham-Dayton Hwy at 7:00 pm. The third and **Final Leader Certification Meeting for the 2017-2018 year** will be at the HR room next to the 4-H office in Oroville, **WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 18, 2017 at 6:30 pm**. We will have Live Scan service available at the meetings, so please bring ID information and money for the fingerprinting. The cost is tentatively set at \$35.

Food Safety Certification

Annual training is required for adult volunteers who are involved with food service and preparation where the general public is involved. **This includes all fundraising and community service activities.** Any club anticipating involvement in food service and preparation activities must have at least one member complete this training. Please note that any food related fundraisers submitted to the 4-H Office will be reviewed for club compliance with this policy. This training is also highly recommended for any project leaders running a food related project. The University's "Make It Safe, Keep It Safe" Food Safety Education has been made available in an online format, and can be accessed at <http://ucanr.edu/sites/MISKIS/Intro/>. The training consists of six learning modules, as well as a pre and post-test. The post-test consists of 11 multiple choice questions and must be completed with a passing score of 80% in order to receive credit and certification. **We have been experiencing some issues with the reporting system, so please e-mail Nicole at nmarshall@ucanr.edu with the date and time of completion and print a copy of your results for submission to the 4-H Office so we can get you a certificate as soon as possible!**

County Wide Archery Project

If you are a 4-H member that is 9 years and older, then you can join the County wide 4-H Archery Project. Member's will learn about archery safety, proper shooting form of two different arrows, making your own leather gear, and will also design and build an arrow. Both the arrow and leather gear can be entered in the Fair or Rainbow Craft Field Day. There will be two sessions with 15 openings per session. The fall session dates are October 28, November 11 & 25, and December 9, 2017. The winter session dates are February 3 & 17, 2018, and March 3 & 17, 2018, and the cost for each sessions is \$15.00. Meetings are Saturdays from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm. All Archery equipment and supplies are provided and the members will be able to compete in the State 4-H Archery Tournament, and a 3-D shoot in Red Bluff.
