*** YQCA must be completed, and the Certificate needs to be emailed prior to entering! *** Certificate must be valid thru May 28, 2023

SEE WEBSITE FOR MARKET ENTRY & LOTTERY INFORMATION. Lottery will be in effect for all species if entry limits are reached. In order to be eligible for this lottery, entries must be received by December 8th by 12:00 NOON.

Market Goat, Hog & Lamb entries open Thursday Dec. 1, 2022. Limited to 210 combined market lambs & goats & 270 market hogs. Entry fee: \$15.00.

Entries close 5:00 p.m. March 24, 2023 (60-day ownership deadline).

- Photo of exhibitor with market goat, hog, or lamb (& back-up animals) must be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. March 24, 2023, with a copy of bill of sale with breeder name & scraple info for goats & lambs, breeder's name for hogs.
- Send proof of ownership documents & photos to <u>livestock@eliverdollarfair.org</u> Please include child's name, club & species in the email subject line. Thank you!
- Rabbit Meat Pen entries open 8:00 a.m. Feb. 1, 2023 & are limited to 40 meat pens. Entry fee: \$15.00. Entries close 5:00 p.m. April 25, 2023 (30-day ownership deadline). Entries will be accepted online.
 - Photo of exhibitor with meat pens with tattoos, tattoo numbers & name of breeder must be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. April 25, 2023.
 - Send proof of ownership documents & photos to <u>livestock@silverdollarfair.org</u> Please include child's name, club & species in the email subject line. Thank youl
- Market Steer entries opened Sept. 21, 2022 & limited to 45 entries. Entries close 5:00 p.m. Jan. 24, 2023 (120 day ownership deadline).
 - Photo of exhibitor with market steer (& any back-up steers) & breeding information (Bill of Sale) must be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. Jan. 24, 2023. Photos & Breeder info may be submitted anytime, no later than 5 pm Jan. 24. Don't wait until the last minute.
 - Send proof of ownership documents, photos & breeder info to <u>livestock@silverdollarfair.org</u> Please include child's name, club & species in the email subject line. Thank youl
- See market animal information on the Fair website for entry limits, lottery rule, entry fees, weight limits, back-up animal rule & other important information. Backup animals must pay \$15.00 entry fee & submit all proof of ownership documentation by deadlines.

**YQCA must be completed prior to entering! Certificate must be valid thru May 28, 2023 for Silver Dollar Fair.

If you were in 4-H this past year, you must have completed and turn in your Record Books to your CCL for evaluation (all signatures required) no later than November 30th! If this was not done, you will not be qualified to show and sell an animal at the 2023 fairs.

Livestock members must have been enrolled in 4-H no later than October 20th to be eligible to show and sell at the Silver Dollar Fair.

Butte County Fair



Attention ALL 2023 Livestock Exhibitors:

The Butte County Fair is switching entry systems to the modern **ShoWorks** software starting with the upcoming 2023 fair. Through this software exhibitors will be able to login into a previously made account if they have one created for other fairs (ex. Silver Dollar, State Fair). If they are new to the ShoWorks system they will have to create an account that they can use for future years. NO MORE account set up each year.

With the move to ShoWorks the system offers an app that you can download for free in the App

Store or Google Play called SHOWORKS PASSPORT (also available on Web Version). Here you can receive information related to updates like entry deadlines, paperwork due date, upcoming events, etc. We highly encourage all exhibitors to download this app as it is one of the fastest ways to receive information published by the fair. If parents are interested in the app as well, you will need to login through your exhibitors account. When downloading and creating an account for Passport it is important that you provide as much information as possible. This will allow the system to search and see if you have past entries at other fairs.

Other information that you need to know while nominating a Market Steer:

- 1. Grange exhibitors will ONLY compete in the 4-H division regardless of age
- Independent exhibitors will continue to be entered in divisions based on their age. 14 and over will show in FFA

Market Steer Exhibitors - IMPORTANT CHANGES:

ShoWorks has a feature they offer called Nominations. The way it works is, exhibitors interested in showing a Market Steer at the fair will **log in on Oct 27th** and follow these steps: Step 1: Log into ShowWorks (fairwire webpage) Step 2: Select Market Steer & Appropriate Class Step 3: Must Check out WITHOUT PAYING (it will send you a confirmation email when completed)

Again this is just a nomination process. Once the limits are hit the system will automatically shut down. However the <u>Waitlist</u> and <u>Back Up</u> options will remain open. The back ups will not factor

into the count for limits.

Once entries open for all large animals, those exhibitors who nominated to show a steer will receive a Validation Code. Only the exhibitors who receive a validation code will be eligible to officially enter a Market Steer and pay the entry fees. At that time you will enter information like Ear Tag, Bill of Sale, etc.

Nominations will remain open from Thursday, Oct 27 at 9 AM through November 30 midnight, UNLESS the limit is met before that date.

Avian Influenza

The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) have detected cases of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) in counties throughout California.

On August 16, the Butte County Ag Commissioner was notified of an avian influenza case in Butte County. As the days unfolded, by August 19, 1,100 birds were depopulated.

2022-2023 Enrollment

Why is Your Youth's Enrollment Being Returned ?

Your youth's enrollment is being returned to you because the emergency contact is incorrect. The emergency contact is for emergencies only, when the two parents/guardians are un-reachable. So, it needs to be someone other than the 2 Parents/ Guardians. If there is not a second parent/guardian, leave the second parent blank. Remember the parents or guardian should not be listed as an emergency contact. To correct, sign into your enrollment account, click re-submit beside the youth's name (not view), click next till you get to the emergency contact and correct the error. Then, keep clicking next until the end and then submit their enrollment again.

You will receive an email with the reason, but it is at the very end of the email under **Comments**.

 - CWF knows this, and will reject any registrations accidentally put in by individuals
- California 4-H offers two different trips for CWF
 - Attendance at CWF plus additional days for fun and educational sightseeing exclusively available for California 4-H members (CWF Extended Trip)
 - Attendance at only the CWF conference planned by National 4-H Council (CWF Only)
- California 4-H send all of our attendees during the same week to streamline logistics and keep costs low
 - This year, our goal is to attend during the Fourth of July CWF Session (Schedule Linked Here); two counties have already expressed interest in attending this session
 - This session has unique activities not part of the other CWF Sessions
 - It may seem odd to encourage a 4-H trip during a national holiday, but celebrating Independence Day in our nation's capital can be a once in a lifetime opportunity
- This event has a considerable cost
 - Historically, team attendees have fundraised to obtain sponsorships for the trip
 - All counties on our list (except for Modoc) should have funds with their Council or VMO raised by the bi-annual Tractor Supply Paper Clovers event
 - This money is allocated for scholarships at 4-H camps, conferences, and other events that result and civic and leadership education
 - Reach out to your local staff to learn more
